Analyzing the Costs of Nontraditional Choices: Role Congruity Theory and College Student's Perception of Attractiveness

Abstract

Researchers have shown that both women and men with traits incongruent to their gender roles are viewed as less competent and are less acceptable than those whose traits conform to their gender roles. The present looks at the effect of role congruity between gender, occupational status and personality traits and the effect that this has on the evaluation of potential romantic partner attractiveness. Little research has looked at the effect of both status characteristics such as occupation or college major and personal traits such as personality, likes-dislikes or hobbies. A vignette experiment will be conducted in which college students will be asked to read a paragraph about a hypothetical peer and then answer survey questions that will assess whether or not they find the person to be an attractive romantic partner. Analysis of this data will help to show the effect that role congruence or incongruence in both occupational status and personality traits has on evaluations of attraction.
